Every year, *Indiana Law Review* has the privilege of composing and hosting a Symposium at the Indiana University Robert H. McKinney School of Law. Each annual Symposium is designated a different topic that relates to the law. Knowledgeable legal scholars, professionals, and the like are asked to speak at the Symposium to give insight on their expertise. Selected speakers are then asked to submit an article on the topic to the *Indiana Law Review*, with the potential to be published in the following year's publication.
